Fourfold benefits

- 1. First day starts without preliminaries.
- 2. The model for the entire semester is set in motion.
- 3. Practice becomes integral to the course.
- 4. Students know what to do when the semester starts.





Commit to the approach

To get started, choose one or two activities to try.





Seven distinct parts of planning

- 1. Student and teaching filing systems
- 2. Schedule
- 3. Pre-class invitation letter to students
- 4. Screencast introduction
- 5. Directions for the semester
- 6. Reminders
- 7. Recheck class roster

Step 1: Create file system

- Structure weekly teaching folder with template for future semesters
- Create student folders and Dropbox link

Step 2: The schedule

Plan from the back of the course. Mark milestones so you know what to practice

Step 3: The letter

- Write a conversational syllabus in the first person and list the Dropbox link
- Link to BEFORE THE FIRST CLASS Dropbox folder
- Set up a MailChimp campaign

Step 4: Make a short screencast

- Who I am
- · Brief survey of the syllabus
- This self-playing QuickTime movie should be placed in your student folder

Step 5: Create a jump-off webpage

- Set up a home page with all the links you'll use in the course. (Can use Weebly.com)
 - This launch site should have easily entered links.
 - · Easily viewable on mobile devices.

- Ask students to sign up by cell or email for course deadlines on remind.com
- Use youcanbook.me for student conferencing
